The new F3N class started the day off. All of these pilots are now part of the first-ever official F3N Nats competition in the US. With this being the first time, everyone is learning how the judging works and how demanding this format is. It's very entertaining to watch! With two rounds complete, Jamie Roberston and Nick Maxwell are in commanding leads.

In F3C the competition is fierce. With this event being used to decide who represents the US in next year's World Championship, many of the top F3C guys are here. The new schedule of maneuvers is challenging everyone. Nick Maxwell, doing double duty in F3C and F3N, is out to an early lead. But after only two of seven scheduled rounds, it is far from locked up.

The Expert class and Advanced class only have two entries each, but that doesn't take away from the superb flying by all of the pilots.

Finally, in the Sportsman class we have five entries—three that competed in past Nats and two new pilots, Vincent Drouillon and Dan Brickman, joining us this year. Welcome new guys!

We are always happy to get new people into the sport, and after two rounds it looks like they are both doing a great job.

Last but not least is the Scale class. It is only made up of two entries, but so far the competition is pretty tight.

For those of you who want to know what the trends in equipment are, I can say there is a wide array of equipment being used in all of the classes. There are a number of SAB Goblins at the Nats this year, but almost all of the major brands are also represented. We even have Don Miller flying a nitro flybarred heli competing in the Expert class, again proving it's all about the loose nut behind the sticks rather than the machine.
