




**Mutual Agreement of Understanding  
Between  
THE ACADEMY OF MODEL AERONAUTICS, INC.  
and  
MODEL AERONAUTICS ASSOCIATION OF CANADA, INC.**


Based on the understanding and representation of Model Aeronautics Association of Canada, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "MAAC") that MAAC insurance coverage extends to its individual members while acting in or on behalf of or within the scope of their modeling activities while at an AMA Chartered Club and/or at an AMA Sanctioned Event in the 50 United States; and further, based on the understanding and representation of MAAC that the Canadian Insurance Policy will thus apply to such MAAC members, while they are engaged in modeling activities at an AMA Chartered Club and/or at an AMA Sanctioned Event as members of MAAC in the 50 United States; and further recognizing and agreeing that The Academy of Model Aeronautics, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "AMA") insurance coverage will not be applicable and will not provide coverage to such MAAC members in the 50 United States; and further recognizing it is the understanding of the AMA that its insurance coverage will provide coverage to its AMA members while in Canada and engaged in modeling activities, and further recognizing and agreeing that the MAAC coverage will not provide coverage for AMA participants in Canada; therefore, MAAC and the AMA hereby agree and enter into this agreement so that registered MAAC members may operate model aircraft in any of the 50 United States at AMA sanctioned events and/or join an AMA Chartered Club, and any AMA members may operate model aircraft in Canada at MAAC sanction events and/or join a MAAC Chartered Club.

In consideration for permitting registered MAAC members operating model aircraft in any of the 50 United States, and in consideration of permitting registered AMA members to operate model aircraft in Canada, MAAC and the AMA hereby agree and represent:

1. It will inform their registered members of the provisions and scope of this agreement; and,
2. That all registered MAAC members, while operating model aircraft in any of the 50 United States, will abide by both the AMA and MAAC safety codes. Where the two codes are in disagreement, the more stringent of the two shall apply. Only approved United States frequencies shall be used for radio control activities; and,
3. That all registered AMA members, while operating model aircraft in Canada, will abide by both the AMA and MAAC safety codes. Where the two codes are in disagreement, the more stringent of the two shall apply. Only approved Canadian frequencies shall be used for radio control activities.
4. Canadian residents may join the AMA and American residents may join MAAC, but each must first be a member of his/her own national organization.
