

The AMA History Project Presents: Biography of WILLIAM RALPH WEAVER

The following was published in the May 1955 issue of Model Aviation, from the article "Know Your Officers." He served as District IX from 1955 to 1956.

William Ralph Weaver – A name that we see on the list of AMA officers for the first time – he's Vice President of AMA District IX. Mr. and Mrs. Weaver live at 611 South Lightner Drive, Wichita, Kansas.

Since first building a Comet *Mercury* in 1937, Bill has been actively interested in model flying – lately directing his attention toward Free Flight Gas, Radio Control, and Rubber models. He is a member of the Wichihawk Model Airplane Club, as well as the Wichita Radio Control Club. He has served as club secretary in 1950 and 1953 and as president in 1951 and 1952. It is a wonder that he has found time to officiate at various contests, including the International Competition Eliminations and other meets at Wichita, Kansas, Jefferson City and Columbia, Missouri.

Mr. Weaver advocates the provision of sponsorship for programs such as our National Championships and the World Championships by the AMA and suggests that activity should be encouraged by service organizations, large corporations, Army, Navy, and Air Force.

Bill foresees a fine future in store for modeling, reminding us that this is a scientific age – and expressing the opinion that modeling should soon become more popular over large areas and that it should become a more important part in scientific training and research.

The following was published in the October 1965 issue of Model Aviation, from the column "About the Nominees" - written descriptions of candidates up for election/reelection to AMA elected positions. Mr. Weaver won the election, and served as District XI from 1966 to 1968.

Nationals. Believes AMA should reflect current needs of this sport by providing dynamic leadership and supporting new events such as Goodyear Racing, Scale Aerobatics and continued support of international teams.
