The following was published in the March 1987 issue of Model Aviation magazine. Lee was a 1986 AMA Scholarship winner.

Lee Mickus, Billings, Montana, received \$1,500 to help him at Harvard University where he plans to major in mathematics. Lee graduated from Billings West High School with a GPA of 3.976, placing third in a class of 488.

His academic skills won him a place in the National Honor Society for two years. He also won letters in three consecutive years in forensics.

Activities outside of school included coaching in Little League baseball, Lt. Governor in the YMCA Youth and Government Program, and club president for American Field Service for two years. His modeling activities are primarily sport flying. However, he has been a keen and active worker at club contests – calling and flagging at Pylon Races and supervising at static displays to present the sport to the public. Usually at the club field every weekend, he will miss the fun and social aspects of the sport while at Harvard.
