District 10 Candidates

Bev Wisniewski, Bellflower, CA. My name is Bev Wisniewski and I am a candidate for Vice-President from District X. Many of you already know me or have worked with me at meets, as I have been very active in all phases of aeromodeling activities for many years. I am probably best known for directing Control Line meets; however, I have also worked many RC and FF meets.

My support of AMA extends from District X to the national scene, in particular the annual national contest where I have worked in Headquarters operation, tabulation, and various events. I have been a Contest Director for many years and started my Nats service in 1952. Locally, I have worked in the AMA booth at the trade shows.
