Academy of Model Aeronautics Awards \$46,500 in Scholarships to College-Bound Model Aviation Pilots

The Academy of Model Aeronautics has awarded \$46,500 in scholarship funds to thirteen high school graduates from across the nation.

Muncie, IN—The Academy of Model Aeronautics has awarded \$46,500 in scholarship funds to thirteen high school graduates from across the nation.

The Academy of Model Aeronautics Scholarship Fund was created to award qualified AMA Youth Members with scholarships to pursue technical careers. Since its inception in 1970, the AMA Scholarship Program has awarded nearly \$900,000 to college-bound aero-modelers. The scholarships are granted from funds donated by model aviation organizations and individuals, AMA member donations, a portion of AMA member dues and direct donations from the Academy of Model Aeronautics.

The Charles H. Grant Scholarship Program contains other grants that look at additional factors to determine the award. The Toledo Weak Signals award begun in 1988, and is awarded to the top three recipients of the AMA/Charles H. Grant Scholarship.

The Telford Scholarship is given out each year and is based on participation in competition activity in AMA and FAI events. Added in 2013, the Basil and Dorothy Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a current college student pursuing an engineering or technical degree while enrolled at an accredited four-year institution. New this year, the AMA awarded \$1,000 from the Ryan Sherrow Scholarship. This scholarship, started in memory of an AMA Youth member will continue to be awarded annually.
