## **Give Brief Summary of the Proposed Change:**

In order to keep the playing field as level as possible, there need to be a matrix of what categories and how many categories a contestant can enter at an event.

#2.General

A contestant may make only one entry in each scale event, unless more are specifically allowed by the event rules.

Most events will allow a contestant to enter up to 3 classes at a single event.

- 511 Sportsman Scale, Open Scale, 519 Pro/Am Pro (Intermediate)
